On behalf of The Education Over Debt Foundation, (EOD) I am honored to share a reflection on our accomplishments this year as we work to prepare students for acquiring higher education without all the debt.

This year, The Education Over Debt Foundation provided \$6,000 in scholarships to students attending a 4-year College. The funds included two high school students attending college as a freshman and one EOD past scholarship recipient attending college as a junior. This supports our vision to reduce financial barriers when acquiring higher education.

I am happy to share that we have continued our partnership with Upward Bound and collaborated with Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools to grow our impact in the community. Our collaborative approach has helped to refine and strengthen our effectiveness with high school students to achieve their personal and career goals. Furthermore, we expanded our workshops topics to discuss personal empowerment, goal setting, critical thinking, and money management to support students in their decision making, resourcefulness, and mental wellness. Lastly, we hosted two 5K Run/Walks to expose students to a healthier physical lifestyle by allowing students the opportunity to volunteer to support the runners.






Education Over Debt Foundation Four-Year Analysis


Education Over Debt Four-Year Financial Analysis




FY 2024 Income and Expenses




